- National recognition that Reading Recovery has research-based, proven results
 - One example: 75% of lowest performing first graders in 12-20 weeks accelerate to average with Reading Recovery




Dollars spent now in RR **will result in greater savings later**

- 60-80% who reach average NEVER need additional support
- Savings in small group Title I
- Savings in Special Ed
- Savings in retentions

Results demonstrated on
over 2 million children

RR's Role in Response to Intervention (RTI)

- Short term one-to-one intervention (Tier 2 or 3)
- Screening identifies children most in need
- Progress monitoring used daily to plan lessons

Who is a Reading Recovery teacher?

- ½ time Reading Recovery
 - Teaches an average of 8.1 RR children each year
- ½ time in another role
 - Teaches an average of 49 total children each year



How many Reading Recovery teachers should I have?

- The goal is to serve all students who need this support
- Minimum served is 20% of all first graders in a building
- Target: 1 RR teacher per 2 first grade classrooms
- This will dramatically cut future costs



How **can** I pay for Reading Recovery Teachers?

- Title I
- RTI
- Other special funds
- General funds



What other roles do Reading Recovery teachers play?

- Title 1 small groups
- ELL
- ½ day kindergarten
- Share first grade classroom
- Reading coach, data manager
- Special Ed teacher



Recruiting Schools

A school has to meet at least ONE of the following criteria to be eligible:

- A school on the state's School Improvement Grant list
- A Title I school in restructuring or corrective action
- A school that is in a rural LEA
- A school that has a sizeable population of ESL students.



Grant will pay all professional development expenses during training year

- Tuition for graduate credit
- Books, materials, supplies
- Instructional fees
- Professional development stipend to district



Schools will agree to--

- Keep teacher in role for 3 years
- Participate in the federal evaluation activities
- Maintain Reading Recovery guidelines and standards



RR guidelines and standards

- Affiliate with Teacher Leader training site
- Trained Reading Recovery teacher will
 - Participate in 6 ½ day professional development activities and school visits
 - Teach as part of professional development behind a glass
 - Collect and report evaluation data
